Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time First Reading: Wisdom 2.12, 17-20

Second Reading: James 3.16-4.3 Gospel: Mark 9.30-37

The word 'peace' comes across with many meanings. It can mean absence of war, or conflict or non-violence. I often think about the many people throughout our history who have built 'peace as their motto' and have brought down mighty kingdoms through peaceful non-violent protest.

Today's readings speak a lot about peace, especially the letter to James. It is both practical and pragmatic because James challenges us to look squarely at ourselves and make changes for the better. In addition, he wants us to become better disciples of Jesus in a very real way by

overcoming our own disordered passions and selfishness through Christ's peace.

At this moment in history, the holy Catholic and Apostolic Church needs to strive for peace and needs an awareness of her disordered passions so that repentance and renewal can happen. This will only happen when we repent, convert and turn our backs on sin. None of us are excluded from this duty and responsibility—bishops, priests, deacons and lay people.

If we do not live like disciples of Jesus, we cannot attain the peace he promises us. Are we going to be like little children (see Mark 9:36) or will we give in to our passions and selfishness which will lead us to perdition?
