Our Evangelization Team has continued to deliver more faith filled programs with the goal of forming disciples. Some of them include the second level of Theology of the Body called Into The Heart. Twenty-two people were in attendance, four were from other parishes. As well, an eight week Bible study on Lamentations was held. The biggest project was a Forum on Sexual Abuse. A program for the laity delivered by the laity. The group heard talks from Archbishop Albert LeGatt as well as other renowned speakers regarding the sexual abuse crisis rocking the church. Those in attendance divided up into small groups to come up with a working document that would protect the laity, initiate healing and recovery, as well as an action plan on how to move forward in a constructive manner. A nine page report was delivered and discussed with Archbishop LeGatt in person in December. It is being considered as a blueprint or template that could be used for other parishes. As well, 3 evenings were held featuring talks from the Evangelization Summit for the past two years. We are pleased to announce that our men's group—which brought in men from different parishes—was a resounding success. They followed a program developed by Deacon Gilles called "Into the Breach." There is talk the men's group will continue in the fall.

BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

2018 CAPITAL PROJECTS

- Rebuilding of stone stairs completed
- Reinstallation of railings (to be completed this summer)
- Retaining walls partially completed (to be completed this summer)
- Boiler overhaul completed and multiple heating system repairs completed
- Electrical panel replaced in old residence
- Installed 'in wall' heater in Adoration Chapel entrance
- Converted church lights to LED
- Working with insurance company re: boiler overhaul and possible insurance coverage for Multi-Purpose room repairs
- Primary steps for kitchen/hall renovation underway (drawings and mechanical schematics)

2019 CAPITAL PROJECTS

- Kitchen, hall and washroom renovations. Exploring possibility of doing the renovations in steps - starting with kitchen
- Exploring possibility of converting church from steam heat to hot water heating as re-piping of system is required (95 year-old piping is wearing out and requires regular repairs)
- Adoration Chapel upgrades to include installation of HRV system, electrical upgrading, new flooring, painting and installation of a votive stand
- Church sanctuary upgrades including electrical and new audio visual screen
- Pending Multi-Purpose room repairs re: insurance claim
- Exterior tuck pointing repairs of church stonework in crucial areas
