BULLETIN REFLECTION

"So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and find grace for timely help" (Hebrews 4:16)

The theme of this Sunday's readings is service and being a servant to others. I was at a wedding recently and the couple after the dinner and speeches decided to do an act of love and they washed each other's feet in front of all the guests. It was a beautiful and Christ-centered experience and this couple consecrated their love and the sacrament to Jesus in a real and visible way.

Today's readings are all about service. Isaiah and Hebrews discuss the suffering servant and the high priest who is the image of Christ Himself. Christ would be the one who offered himself as sin, who was afflicted and bear the guilt of many. Like in Isaiah, Hebrews describes that Jesus is the high priest who sympathizes with all our weaknesses and being tested in all things, yet Jesus as God didn't commit sin. Both the First and Second readings are reminding us that the suffering servant, the High priest are meant to give their lives for others, and this is what Jesus fulfills and completes. He came that all people may be saved, and he did this through suffering.

The idea of suffering in our culture is troubling for many and reflects an attitude that life is meaningless and that suffering, and pain need to be avoided at all costs. This explains why so many people in our society devalue human life by supporting passively or actively the killing on innocent human beings and the elderly, disabled and the infirm. Suffering causes us to go deeper into ourselves and requires us to give ourselves for others. One of the great ways to give life to others is by suffering even though it goes against reason and practicality but when offered up for others to bring them comfort and salvation is actual authentic joy. Suffering brings joy and even though it is painful, God purifies and teaches if we would only allow Him. This is why Christianity is true because the relationship with Jesus changes everything and when we follow Him, life will be an adventure.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus rebukes James and John for demanding that they receive the highest honour in heaven with Jesus. He recognized and heard their request saying they will drink of the cup that will be offered to them by martyrdom but James and John and the other 10 fail to understand until Jesus tells them that we must be servants to each other, not being powerful, domineering but a humble servant. Our Lord came to give his life as a ransom for many and this is our proper mission. Like that newly married couple from the reception, washing each others' feet is the way to holiness and the way of service to each other. If we could all serve each more in the way that Christ speaks about her and in other passages, what a wonderful world this would be. I think we can do it, but we are reminded to give our lives for others, and we can do this by approaching the throne of grace where Christ lovingly and joyfully receives our worship and our service.

May God guide us in learning humility from the Master and striving to love with "all the intensity of our being, then we must be ready to sacrifice all things which prevent us from being loving every moment of the day" (Rhonda Chervin).

GOOD NEWS!

Fellow Holy Cross Parishioners,

We have received a letter from the diocesan Financial Administrator bearing good news in response to our proposal and request for approval to replace the elevator/lift.

His Grace, Archbishop Albert LeGatt, has authorized Holy Cross to proceed with the project, estimated to cost \$124,000. The contract is to be awarded to Summit Elevators as proposed.

The Archbishop also authorizes Holy Cross to raise funds for this project, to a maximum of \$121,000, diocesan tax exempt, until November 30, 2024.

We are now able to receive donations towards this project – noting the tax exempt ‘window’ of time. Please be sure to include the words ‘elevator project’ on the memo line of cheques, on e-transfers and/or donation envelopes containing cash.

We are wished all the best with the new elevator that will be a welcome addition to reach the food bank and other Parish functions in the church basement.

Please note that donations to unauthorized projects remain subject to the diocesan levy.

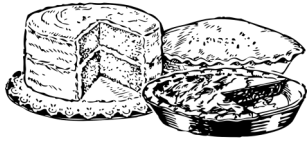
