Advent Reflections 2024 — Week 1

1st Sunday of Advent: Awaken

Each of us must awaken in our own lives, because we fall asleep spiritually amidst our daily concerns and activities—and don't know it. That is the most dangerous thing about spiritual slumber: souls are not conscious of it. The Holy Spirit constantly seeks to awaken us to keep watch", but we have learned to tune Him out with the distractions of our world.

Awakening from Spiritual Sleep

What does it mean to be spiritually awake?

It means to be aware of the true state of affairs: to remember that earthly life is temporary, and eternity forever; that God is present with us, whether people acknowledge Him or not; that we have a vocation to holiness and a heaven that awaits us; that the devil has every intention of preventing us from this holy destiny. For our battle is not against flesh and blood, St. Paul tells us, but against the spiritual forces of evil (Ephesians 6:12).

Monsignor Charles Pope, respected pastor, writer, and speaker, tells us:

"Waking up spiritually means that we gain, increasingly, self-mastery. We engage in the battle against sin, and against inappropriate desires or excessive desires, and we seek to moderate them and gain authority over our life. We act as men and women who are free and responsible for that freedom. And when we sin, we call it what it is, and we repent."

-Monsignor Charles Pope, Advent homily

We can't accomplish any of this without God's help, of course, which means that we need to seek grace from Our Savior through a consistent prayer life.

Practical Steps to Overcome Spiritual Slumber.

An exhortation by St. Anselm suggest to us three action-items we can practice and put in our own lives:

<u>Action 1. Identify—and resist—personal sluggishness.</u>

Each of us experiences, in varying degrees and situations, "sluggishness". We must examine ourselves and consider the ways in which we personally struggle against inertia.

It's possible to *identify personal sluggishness* very quickly: we can start by identifying repeated situations in which we know what we're *supposed* to be doing and yet prefer to do something else. For example, we might have a bad habit of social media scrolling when we *know* we're supposed to be getting to bed or unloading the dishwasher.

Next, we have to *decide on concrete ways* to resist these temptations. We have to surprise ourselves and fight back at inertia with one swift act, however small it may be.

Action 2. Practice diligence in small things.

St. Anselm tells us to stop wasting time in useless imaginings, to let go of sloth, and to practice diligence. To be diligent means to persevere in faithfully accomplishing the responsibilities that are ours—and to *do them to the <u>best of our ability</u>*.

Whether we're cleaning out the fridge, punching in an eight-hour workday, or changing the baby's diaper, we can complete our tasks for God to the best of our ability. Being diligent in small things is crucial since, as Jesus told us, "He who is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much" (Luke 16:10).

We also need to be diligent in turning off the "do, accomplish, perform, putter" urge and to **set aside times for proper rest** and wholesome recreation. After all, the vice of sloth manifests itself both in lassitude **and** in constant busyness.

Action 3. Meditate on the reality of eternity.


St. Anselm urges us to "cleave to the good things which are of God" and to spend time in holy meditation. He reminds us that we cannot, as Christians, be submerged in worldly matters as if this life were all we had and this world our only reality. Earthly life is temporary. Eternity is forever. We can't keep half an eye on our spiritual life and presume that we'll end up in heaven. It takes effort and attentiveness.

The efforts can be small, thoughtful ones. Offering quick prayers and thoughts to God throughout our day keeps our minds on Him.

Let us meditate often on the joyful eternity that awaits us if we do the will of God.

With God's grace, we can remain spiritually awake this Advent and always.
