NOVEMBER 10, 2024—32ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

November marks the final month in the Church year, a time when we reflect on death, the Second Coming of Christ, and the life that is to come. In his first coming, Jesus entered the world humbly, as a child. But his return will be much different. He will come in glory as Judge and Ruler.

Our scripture readings today show us people who were extravagant in their trust in God; widows who were materially poor yet very rich in faith. Clearly, these women trusted deep down in their hearts that God was big enough to supply all of their needs. For it is humility and lowliness that pleases the Lord. We can tend to think that being humble means allowing others to take advantage of us. But the widows demonstrated that true humility means radical dependence on God.



It is significant that these stories are placed before Jesus' description of the final judgment.

When the Lord returns, will he find a people who are humble and in need, willing to surrender their lives totally to him? Or will he find a people full of pride and arrogance, who have no room for him in their hearts? The widows had faith to believe that even giving everything they had to live on, God would never let them down. He was worth everything they had, and they willingly placed themselves in his hands.

Jesus often drew sharp lines between different groups of people. He contrasted the healthy with the sick, the blind with the seeing, and the righteous with the sinners. Speaking with all the drama of a seasoned preacher, he made sure the people knew that there was no middle ground when it came to obeying God. We are either for him or against him.

All this can sound rather intimidating, especially when we consider the jumbled mix of sin and holiness in our own hearts. Does that mean that we aren't good enough? Does the sin remaining in us cancel out whatever holiness we may have achieved?

Not at all. Jesus knows all about us, and he still loves us. He still invites us to be with him. He even offers us his own body and blood in the Eucharist! Clearly, Jesus isn't looking for perfection. He's looking for desire. All he wants is for us to come to him and ask him to heal us and lift us up.

So we don't need to worry about our future. We just need to try to give our heart to Jesus, and he will take it, mold it, and fill it with the fire of his love.

GOOD NEWS!

Fellow Holy Cross Parishioners,

We have received a letter from the diocesan Financial Administrator bearing good news in response to our proposal and request for approval to replace the elevator/lift.

His Grace, Archbishop Albert LeGatt, has authorized Holy Cross to proceed with the project, estimated to cost \$124,000. The contract is to be awarded to Summit Elevators as proposed.

The Archbishop also authorizes Holy Cross to raise funds for this project, to a maximum of \$121,000, diocesan tax exempt, until **November 30, 2024**.

We are now able to receive donations towards this project – noting the tax exempt 'window' of time. Please be sure to include the words 'elevator project' on the memo line of cheques, on e-Transfers and/or donation envelopes containing cash.

We are wished all the best with the new elevator that will be a welcome addition to reach the food bank and other Parish functions in the church basement.

Please note that donations to unauthorized projects remain subject to the diocesan levy.

THE GOOD SHEPHERD CAMPAIGN 2024

Last week, Archbishop LeGatt launched the **2024 Good**

Shepherd Campaign For the Life of the Church! in support of the formation of our seminarians, the costs of bringing in international priests and many pastoral initiatives that ensure the life of the Church in our parishes. We invite you to check out the Campaign poster where you will see the nine young priests who have been supported by your donations, as well as the five seminarians. We also invite you to visit the Archdiocese's website for more testimonials and information. Please note that the collection for the Good Shepherd Campaign will take place on the weekend of November 16 and 17.

During this second week of the Good Shepherd Campaign, we invite you to visit the Archdiocese's website to watch the <u>video</u> of Archbishop LeGatt and our five seminarians.

The cost to support a seminarian is about \$45,000 per year. This includes accommodation and food, tuition, medical insurance and a monthly stipend. For international seminarians, it is also a question of legal fees and transportation to bring him from abroad. At least twice during his studies, we pay for a trip home to see his family.

The cost to bring in an international priest is about \$20,000. This cost includes legal fees, travel, two and a half months' salary paid by the Archdiocese during his enculturation, language classes if needed, and an allowance for him to stock up on supplies for his first winter here.

We invite you to discern in prayer to support the Good Shepherd Campaign 2024, because priests play a vital role *in the Life of the Church*. It is important that we continue to support international seminarians and priests in their vocations.

We invite you to pray for our seminarians as they continue to discern God's will in their lives and their journey toward the priesthood.

November 10, 2024 - 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors

to the treasury. For they all contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, her whole living." - Mark 12:43-44

Jesus gets right to the point – Stewards are all called to give money to support the mission of the Church, regardless of our circumstance. No gift is too small or insignificant! Giving money to support the mission of our local parish is a matter of our faith, just like praying and participating in parish ministries. When you make a financial offering, is it from your "first fruits" or from what is "left over"?
