Bulletin Reflection

The three readings today are encouraging us to keep in mind that our hope and goal is to be with God in heaven. As we end this liturgical year we have an opportunity to evaluate our readiness for the end times. We do not know when this will happen, even as we see the signs all around us.

We see the confusion and hopelessness in our society, but we can be the light to all around us. Do we show in our actions and our reactions that we are Christians? Do we allow Christ's light to shine through us? We know the end times are coming and we need to always be prepared. When this liturgical year ends in a few weeks, we begin a time of preparation for the coming of Christ.

The readings today are a little scary if we do not have our hope in Jesus. Take time to read in Hebrews, understanding that the gift that Jesus gives us is the single sacrifice for all. Note the connection to Daniel with the description of the star. We are all looking forward to the day that Jesus will awaken us from our sleep.

The Collect of today's mass is very comforting, with the words "the constant gladness of being devoted to you". The closer that we are to God, the more gladness and joy we will have.

On this day of the poor, think of all the poor that we have right here in our city. Take time to pray for the poor. If possible, provide food or monetary donation to the food bank. We can also spend time with the elderly that may be housebound. Taking time with them can be a great gift to someone who is lonely.

As we close today, let us keep our priests in our prayers, not only the priests in our parishes and diocese, but also those individuals discerning the priesthood. Let us also keep the Good Shepherd Campaign close to our hearts and pray that with the proceeds, we will be able to train future priests to support us tomorrow. Let us pray for them because we know they are praying for us.

Good News!

Fellow Holy Cross Parishioners,

We have received a letter from the diocesan Financial Administrator bearing good news in response to our proposal and request for approval to replace the elevator/lift.

His Grace, Archbishop Albert LeGatt, has authorized Holy Cross to proceed with the project, estimated to cost \$124,000. The contract is to be awarded to Summit Elevators as proposed.

The Archbishop also authorizes Holy Cross to raise funds for this project, to a maximum of \$121,000, diocesan tax exempt, until November 30, 2024.

We are now able to receive donations towards this project - noting the tax exempt 'window' of time. Please be sure to include the words 'elevator project' on the memo line of cheques, on e-Transfers and/or donation envelopes containing cash.

We are wished all the best with the new elevator that will be a welcome addition to reach the food bank and other Parish functions in the church basement.

Please note that donations to unauthorized projects remain subject to the diocesan levy.
