PARISH BULLETIN SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING—November 24, 2024

A good friend asked me, "Don't you know that you are a son of a King?" When I heard this, it struck me that we are sons and daughters of Christ the King! His kingdom is wonderful and glorious!!

Today is the Solemnity of Christ the King and the last Sunday of the liturgical year. This feast was inaugurated in 1925 by Pope Pius X11 in response to the rise of Marxism and Socialism in different parts of the world and to promote the idea that Christ is Lord above all and that there is no end to His reign.

Today's readings focus on kingdom and king. In the gospel, Pilate asked Jesus if he was a king. Jesus replied, "My kingdom is not from this world...my kingdom is not from here... You say that I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." (Jn. 18: 33b-37).

- When Jesus was born, wise men (magi) came to bring gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. These gifts of such exultant honour were meant for a king. Jesus is the King, born for the Jews and all people. These men gave their tribute to the baby Jesus. By doing this, they recognized that someone greater than they was before them. Their response was to prostrate and give all that they had.
- Jesus avoided being crowned as king during his public ministry. His kingdom was not one of power but of service, of giving His life for the ransom of many.
- Bethlehem (House of Bread) begins His kingdom and Calvary completes it. Pilate did not understand what Jesus meant, thinking that a king was one like Caesar.
- Jesus is crowned with thorns and crucified with the words 'Jesus of Nazareth King of the Jews'. He is a king that suffers and endures unbearable pain. His pain is our hope and our strength. His Kingdom is not one of violence but of love. Only through love can Christ's suffering be understood.

Pope Benedict XVI has profound words on this Solemnity:

"The feast of Christ the King is therefore not a feast of those who are subjugated but a feast of those who know that they are in the hands of the One who writes straight on crooked lines".

So let us remember that we are sons and daughters of a king. Long live CHRIST THE KING!

Good News!

Fellow Holy Cross Parishioners,

We have received a letter from the diocesan Financial Administrator bearing good news in response to our proposal and request for approval to replace the elevator/lift.

His Grace, Archbishop Albert LeGatt, has authorized Holy Cross to proceed with the project, estimated to cost \$124,000. The contract is to be awarded to Summit Elevators as proposed.

The Archbishop also authorizes Holy Cross to raise funds for this project, to a maximum of \$121,000, diocesan tax exempt, until **November 30, 2024**.

We are now able to receive donations towards this project – noting the tax exempt 'window' of time. Please be sure to include the words '<u>elevator project'</u> on the memo line of cheques, on e-Transfers and/or donation envelopes containing cash.

We are wished all the best with the new elevator that will be a welcome addition to reach the food bank and other Parish functions in the church basement.

Please note that donations to unauthorized projects remain subject to the diocesan levy.

Christ the King Novena

The Solemnity of Christ the King was established in 1925 by Pope Pius XI amidst the economic and social upheaval after World War I. This feast extols the supremacy of Jesus Christ over all peoples for all time. Patron saint of the Kingdom of Jesus.

Start on November 15th

Feast Day November 24th

The Novena consists of the following prayers, to be said on nine separate occasions during the course of one day or over the course of nine days.

Day 1 Prayer

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Almighty and merciful God, you break the power of evil and make all things new in your Son Jesus Christ, the King of the universe.

May all in heaven and earth acclaim your glory and never cease to praise you.

We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

- Glory Be

O Lord our God, You alone are the Most Holy King and Ruler of all nations.
