#### Second Sunday of Advent -

#### The Lord has Done Great Things for Us; We are Filled With Joy – Psalms 126:3

I love the season of Advent, a time for preparing both our hearts and our homes for the feast of Christmas. It's important to take time during these weeks of Advent to prepare our hearts, to reflect on the year, and to make right our hearts for the Lord. This season happens at the darkest time of the year when days are becoming shorter. Is this so that we can see the light of Jesus? How are you preparing for the coming of Jesus? Are you praying like Paul, with joy in your heart for your fellow parishioners? In the Gospel, Luke went into some detail about who was in power. The Bible carries so much history that shows us that real people lived on the same earth we live on. In the Atrium, one of the first presentations that the children are shown, is a globe. The globe is just two colours; blue for the oceans and brown (with sand texture), the continents. The children usually recognize the globe and some even know where they are. We place a red dot indicating Israel where Jesus lived. We do this to show that Jesus lived in a real place. Luke wrote his gospel many years ago, and many of us have never been to Israel. But, with the WORD we hear today, Luke provides us with the details to show who was in power and the location of their rule. The reading then ends with a prophecy from Isaiah. John the Baptist was born before Jesus, and he prepared the way for Jesus' ministry. John's journey was hard as he encountered the people of the region of Jordan. John's birth was a miracle since Zachariah and Elizabeth were advanced in age. After he was born the whole region of Judea wondered what kind of man John would grow up to be (Luke 1:66). Because John said "Yes" to God's mission, he prepared the people for Jesus. Are you sharing the Gospel with others? Do others see you and know that you are a Christian by the way you love others? Share the hope and peace that Jesus gave to us, with someone you see this week.

#### National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples - December 12, 2024

To mark the National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples, which takes place on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadelupe, the Canadian Catholic Indigenous Council (CCIC) recalls the profound sorrow expressed by Pope Francis, during his Penitential Pilgrimage to Canada in July 2022, for the catastrophic effects of the residential school system on Indigenous communities, as well as the journey of reconciliation and healing we have embarked upon together. Two years later, the Pope's words still compel us to recognize this painful legacy and walk alongside the Indigenous Peoples in a spirit of repentance, solidarity, and hope. We contemplate the Holy Father's words: "The Church is the house where we conciliate anew, where we meet to start over and to grow together". This vision of the Church as a "living body of reconciliation" has guided us in our ongoing commitment to justice and healing. Together we pray: O God, Creator and Father of all, with humility and hope, we, your children, acknowledge the relationship in You of all living things. For this we thank You and praise You. We call on You, Great Mystery, our God who comes to us in Jesus Christ, Your Son – our Lord, teacher, prophet and brother – to open our minds and hearts as we continue to walk the difficult, yet critical journey of reconciliation and healing. In our world of such blessed diversity, we see so many struggles and obstacles to oneness and unity. We implore You to heal our brokenness and division. Show us in Jesus the way to unity among the multiplicity of Your peoples in our world. We also pray that You will quide and lead us in the Truth, and show us how to be a people who walk with You. May we be a people of Respect, Humility, Courage, Honesty, and Compassion - as we find Your Wisdom on the Spirit-led journey that supports deep healing and fosters renewed relationships. Lord, make us channels of Your Peace, Hope, and Love! +Amen

### Advent Reflections 2024 — Week 2

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent: Repent

John the Baptist was the greatest of all the prophets, a "voice in the wilderness", a herald of Christ the King, telling us how to get ready for His coming. The heart of his message was "Repent." Change.

#### Repentance is what Christ demands.

The Lord loves *us*—not our sin. That is why we must change or—more specifically—repent. We cannot be content with remaining in our sin and brokenness; we must desire to be healed.

In order to become a willing channel of God's grace for others, we must personally grow in virtue.

As Venerable Fulton Sheen said,

"The world's greatest need is someone who will understand that there is no greater conquest than victory over oneself; ...... someone who will gain victories not by stepping down from the Cross and compromising with the world, but who will suffer in order to conquer the world."

#### **True Repentance**

Knowing that the weeks leading up to the celebration of Christ's birth are a special time for repentance, it's helpful to refresh our understanding of what it means to repent.

#### True repentance is:

- **Voluntary sorrow** [for having offended] God, for having done something wrong, together with the resolve to amend one's conduct by taking the necessary means to avoid the occasions of sin.
- Interior repentance is a <u>radical reorientation of our whole life</u>, a return, a conversion to God with all our heart, an end of sin, a turning away from evil, with repugnance toward the evil actions we have committed. At the same time it entails the desire and resolution to change one's life, with hope in God's mercy and trust in the help of his grace...
- God gives us the strength to begin anew. It is in discovering the greatness of God's love that our heart is shaken by the horror and weight of sin and begins to fear offending God by sin and being separated from him.
- —The Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1431, 1432

Repentance is interior and usually hidden—a response to grace, an act of the will; an interior wrestling with oneself, a confession of sin in the sacrament established by Christ, and a resolution to resist and overcome one's faults through the grace of God.

#### **Subtle Sins and Forgotten Faults**

There is incredible freedom in acknowledging sins and offering them to God. He alone can heal us from their effects and set us free from their endless repetition. Sometimes, of course, we are unaware of sins that we commit on a regular basis—we might not even realize certain things are sinful. But how can we uncover faults that we might not be aware of?

For one thing, we can ask the people who live with us and are closest to us, "What are my faults?" And be ready for what they tell you. Other people often know our faults better than we do.

We should also spend time with a detailed examination of conscience before receiving the Sacrament of Confession. Why detailed? Because, if we are looking at a short examination of conscience that refers to the Ten Commandments, we might read the Second Commandment and ask ourselves, "Do I take the Lord's name in vain?" and answer, "Hmm. No, I don't swear."

But if we read a detailed examination of conscience for the Second Commandment, it might ask us, "Do you consume entertainment that treats God, His Church, and sacred things with irreverence?" And then we might realize, "Oh. I've done this—and I didn't realize that was related to taking His name in vain."

That's why a detailed examination is so enlightening and grace-filled. It gives us a greater awareness of how to love God and avoid sin.

#### Conclusion

The confessional is the most important place in which repentance takes place. Each confession gives us the graces we need to courageously resist future temptations. We should be sure to receive this sacrament regularly—many priests recommend once a month as a good consistency, though some people find it helpful to go more often.

May this holy season grant us a new spirit of repentance and a new love for the God who saves us.
