Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

God told his prophet to speak words of comfort and tenderness to his people: "Don't be afraid! The Lord will gather you all together, as a shepherd gathers his sheep, and bring you back home."

Like the Israelites, we all need comfort from God. None of us is free from the sadness that can come from life in this world. It could be the isolation that we face, or pain of an illness, the



wound from a broken relationship, or the challenge of unemployment or financial stress. No matter what we are facing, God wants to comfort us. He wants to speak tenderly to our hearts and tell us that he is with us. And more than anything else, he wants to tell us that Jesus, who is "God with us," has opened heaven for us. We don't have to endure our challenges on our own. We don't have to go through this life doing nothing but trying our best and hoping for better days. We have access to the grace and comfort, the power and wisdom, of God himself!

In our Gospel today, the people who had come to hear John the Baptist knew and expected something explosive. Maybe he was the Christ, the Messiah, come to cast out the Romans and their henchmen and restore Israel to its former glory.

But instead they found Jesus, a lowly carpenter from a small town, who spent his time with the powerless and the sinful, a humble man preaching love of enemies.

At his baptism, Jesus publicly embraces our human condition. He made it clear that he was identifying himself with our full humanity, even our sin. And "his Father was well pleased." So no matter how difficult or demanding life may seem at this time, let these truths bring comfort. Nothing prevented Jesus from coming two thousand years ago and nothing will prevent him from coming again to bring heaven down to earth.

Even as we wait, nothing can prevent Jesus from coming into our hearts right now and comforting us with his loving presence.

Food Bank News

It is with great fanfare we would like to acknowledge our longest standing volunteer at Holy Cross food bank. On Friday, January 24, Paul Carbotte will celebrate his 90th birthday. Paul was a volunteer at the food bank when it first started up more than 35 years ago. He is still going strong every Wednesday, faithfully showing up to help make sandwiches for our patrons. Paul is a beacon of what it means to have a servant's heart. We wish him many blessings and many more years of life and love as he celebrates the day he was born. The world is such a better place with him in it! If you see Paul, please take a moment to wish him well on this incredible milestone.

Heart felt thanks for the massive donations of chocolates in November and December from parishioners. All of our patrons were so happy to get a sweet treat at Christmas they didn't expect. We would also like to acknowledge St. Boniface Diocesan High School for carrying out a huge food drive before Christmas and delivering several bags and boxes of dry goods. That will go a long way in keeping our shelves filled and we were able to give out a few more canned goods for the holidays. Your monthly support of both the food bank and Bradbury's continues to provide hot meals, meat and personal hygiene items many people wouldn't get otherwise. More than 400 patrons come through our door every month. On December 18, we served a full Christmas sit down dinner with all the trimmings to more than 60 people. None of this would have been possible without your generous donations.

Again we are filled with the deepest gratitude to St. Hyacinthe Parish, La Salle Knights of Columbus Council 7793, Avonlea United Church, in Domain, La Salle Fellowship Church and Caisse Community Centre in LaSalle. We received two massive donations in December both of dry and canned goods as well as substantial cash donations that will sustain us through the winter months.

Many thanks to Christopher Lippens and George Cormier with the LaSalle Knights who spear headed this drive. They also donated dozens of brand new kids coats to hand out to children at our food bank. Their help, dedication and support of our mission has been invaluable. We are so blessed to have these groups collaborate with us in caring for those who need it most.

These groups have been instrumental in helping us live out the Gospel at Holy Cross. Their outpouring of love and genuine goodness to help the most vulnerable reaffirms our Christian commitment to care for one another.

Looking ahead to February, Holy Cross Parish will again be partnering with St. Boniface Street Links to host Coldest Night of the Year. CNOY is a family friendly walk to raise money for a critical social service that serves those battling addiction, experiencing homelessness, poverty and hunger. 
