Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Declare the marvellous works of the Lord among all the peoples" – Ps 96:3

In the scripture reading today, St. Paul is talking about the gifts of the Holy Spirit. The way the Spirit distributes the gifts to each of us, is meant to unite us as Christ's church. Nonetheless, so often we see division in our Church.

The gifts given by the Spirit are meant to be shared. We are a parish full of these gifts of: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, wonder and awe before the Lord. Which of these gifts have you been given? How can you use your gift for our parish? Do you see a gift in someone else? Are you affirming others in the gift they bring to our parish?

In the gospel reading, John recounts the start of Jesus' ministry. Mary, seeing a need for more wine; does not fix it, but goes to Jesus. When we see a need, we can go to Jesus in prayer, asking the Holy Spirit to work through us to fill that need.

When Jesus calls his mother "woman", it is not out of disrespect, but a link to the first woman in Genesis. One woman, Mary, showed faith, while the other woman, Eve, showed lack of faith. Mary's action was to tell the servants to "do whatever he says". How many times do we do what Jesus tells us, and see the blessings? How often do we relate to Eve and choose to doubt? When Jesus turned the water to wine, it was the best wine, not just one jug but six huge jugs. When Jesus comes to us, He brings the best, providing more than we can ever ask for or need. In this sign Jesus lets His glory be seen and the disciples believe in Him.

Are we giving to God our first fruits, our best fruits? Are we scheduling time with Jesus around the day or are we scheduling our day around spending time with Jesus? How can we serve others that we met this week? The gifts that have been given to us and the blessings that we have received are not just for some of us, but for all of us.

It is with great fanfare we would like to acknowledge our longest standing volunteer at Holy Cross food bank. On Friday, January 24, Paul Carbotte will celebrate his 90th birthday. Paul was a volunteer at the food bank when it first started up more than 35 years ago. He is still going strong every Wednesday, faithfully showing up to help make sandwiches for our patrons. Paul is a beacon of what it means to have a servant's heart. We wish him many blessings and many more years of life and love as he celebrates the day he was born. The world is such a better place with him in it! If you see Paul, please take a moment to wish him well on this incredible milestone.

Heart felt thanks for the massive donations of chocolates in November and December from parishioners. All of our patrons were so happy to get a sweet treat at Christmas they didn't expect. We would also like to acknowledge St. Boniface Diocesan High School for carrying out a huge food drive before Christmas and delivering several bags and boxes of dry goods. That will go a long way in keeping our shelves filled and we were able to give out a few more canned goods for the holidays. Your monthly support of both the food bank and Bradbury's continues to provide hot meals, meat and personal hygiene items many people wouldn't get otherwise. More than 400 patrons come through our door every month. On December 18, we served a full Christmas sit down dinner with all the trimmings to more than 60 people. None of this would have been possible without your generous donations.

Again we are filled with the deepest gratitude to St. Hyacinthe Parish, La Salle Knights of Columbus Council 7793, Avonlea United Church, in Domain, La Salle Fellowship Church and Caisse Community Centre in LaSalle. We received two massive donations in December both of dry and canned goods as well as substantial cash donations that will sustain us through the winter months.

Many thanks to Christopher Lippens and George Cormier with the LaSalle Knights who spear headed this drive. They also donated dozens of brand new kids coats to hand out to children at our food bank. Their help, dedication and support of our mission has been invaluable. We are so blessed to have these groups collaborate with us in caring for those who need it most.

These groups have been instrumental in helping us live out the Gospel at Holy Cross. Their outpouring of love and genuine goodness to help the most vulnerable reaffirms our Christian commitment to care for one another.

Looking ahead to February, Holy Cross Parish will again be partnering with St. Boniface Street Links to host Coldest Night of the Year. CNOY is a family friendly walk to raise money for a critical social service that serves those battling addiction, experiencing homelessness, poverty and hunger.
