Eight Sunday in Ordinary Time—March 2, 2025

“Lord, it is good to give thanks to you” Ps 92

As a catechist, I have been preparing the RCIA Teens and will be preparing for Lent with the Catechism families. Lent is a time to slow down and listen to God, to take stock of where we are spending our time and money. Are these things building up our relationship with God? I have been watching the “How to Lent?” program



on Formed, <https://watch.formed.org/how-to-lent>. It was a great way to listen to how others have prepared. Are we fasting from our phones, desserts, or sports? We just need to pray to God to see if that is what would be beneficial to our relationship with Him.

In the gospel reading this week we hear Jesus talking about the blind leading the blind. We all need to continue to work on our relationships. Sometimes I may be the leader but also a student. We all need time for refreshment and time to have our faith bucket filled with the wonderful resources God has given to us in the Bible, Church, and all creation. The reading continues, “No good tree bears bad fruit, nor again does a bad tree bear good fruit.” We need to take time to ensure we are filled with the good soil and planted in Holy ground. Taking the time to slow down, sitting in silence, and knowing that God is always there waiting for us to come to him is important. He has started the conversation; we just need to join the conversation.

It is always easy to criticize when something is different from what we want or expect. Let’s take time to look at our own faults and be humble when we are looking at others. It is beneficial to try looking at a situation from someone else’s perspective, to hear their story and maybe learn something new.

Over the next couple of days, take inventory of what are the good treasures and what are the evil treasures. We are not owners of the items that are in our possession, but stewards of the gifts that God has given us. Are we using these gifts for the betterment of His kingdom? As Fr. Scott Bailey said in his video on Formed, “Let’s give up sin for Lent.” My hope is that you have a blessed Lent!

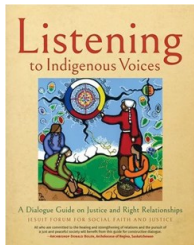
Bishop LeGatt: Christ's Hope in a Chaotic World

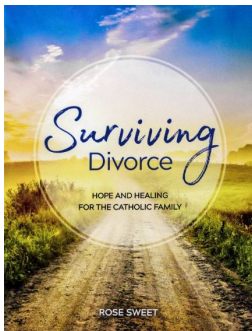

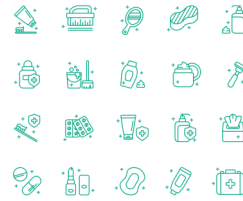
