Third Sunday of LENT

"The Lord Is kind and merciful" - Psalms 103:8

It is common at this time in Lent that everyone is asking each other, "How is your Lent?" All of the praying, fasting, and almsgiving is getting hard at this midpoint in Lent. I hope that it has been a time to get back to some of the basics. Don't worry if you messed up, remember we are imperfect. God does not expect us to be perfect, but to try and keep trying. If what you were doing was not working, try something else. Or if what you are doing seems easy add something new. It was great that two weeks ago the adoration team was talking about the adoration chapel. When I think about Lent, I think about quiet prayer. In the busy-ness of our society, it is important to stop and listen. We need to be in the quiet to be able to hear God. In the Catechism of the Good Shepherd program at Holy Cross, we bring the quiet to the children so that they can experience scripture, prayer, and a time to hear God. One of our songs is "Be still and know that I am God." (Ps 46:10). Take time during this Lent. Take off your sandals and spend time with Jesus like Moses did at the burning bush. Then when God calls you, respond, "Here I am." (Exodus 3:4)

I know that sometimes silence can be uncomfortable and scary when we are carrying sin in our lives, and we are afraid of God's reaction to us. What hinders you from freely living and sharing your faith? There may be times in your life when bad things happen or times when you are misunderstood. Know that you are not alone. There have been many times that I have felt alone or that no one understood me. But as the Psalm today says, we need to remember that God is merciful. We need to repent. What is Jesus wanting: a change of heart and mind, freedom from sin? Be like the gardener in the gospel message. Take time to fertilize your heart and mind with scripture. Allow time for the words to sink in and listen for God's voice. Take time to work through the messages you hear from God that inspire, encourage, and challenge you.


