First Sunday of LENT

God's people have always had to face one fundamental temptation: forgetting the Lord and all the ways he has blessed us. When we forget our past, we tend to think that we're alone in the present, that God isn't with us to help us and guide us.

Because Jesus never forgot his people's history, he was able to resist the devil's temptation. He knew that the God who fed Israel in the desert would not let his Son starve.

In today's first reading, Moses exhorts the people to remember their history and to offer to God their "first fruits" in gratitude. Each year at the beginning of the harvest, they were to recount their story and insert themselves personally into that story: God made *us* his own people, he delivered *us* from slavery, he fed *us* in the desert, he enabled *us* to defeat our enemies and settle in the Promised Land.

We too, have our memories, our history. We remember Jesus' love for us. We remember his teachings, his miracles, and his compassion. We remember his death and resurrection. We remember our own redemption. And as we remember, these events come alive again. We find new grace to resist temptation and continue our journey in faith.

God wants to fill us with his Spirit and his love! He wants to help us make room in our hearts for him. We don't have to be afraid of even the small, daily temptations to break Lenten resolutions. God is here to help us. He promises that when we call upon him, he will answer us. When we cling to him, he will be with us, and he will deliver us, just as he delivered Jesus from the temptations in the desert.

Second Sunday of LENT

Jesus Christ, the all-holy Son of God, gives us, mere mortals, a choice. We are never forced to follow him; he calls us. The real choice is to follow Jesus and accept whatever that decision entails. It is a choice to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, who longs to pour his love into our hearts every day, a choice to believe that with him we can overcome any obstacle, challenge or difficulty. For Jesus is the Son of God who became man so that we could become sons and daughters of God. He is the Lamb of God who laid down his life so that we could be freed from sin and transformed into his very image and likeness.

A week before the magnificent display of Jesus' transfiguration, Jesus had told his apostles for the first time that he was going to be put to death. Now, after having given them a few days to digest this troubling news, Jesus took them up a mountain and gave them a taste of why he would endure such suffering. For just one moment, Jesus showed them what he would look like after the death he had just predicted.

We often speak about bearing our cross or putting to death our human sinfulness. But like Peter, James, and John, who saw Jesus' glory before they experienced his cross and their own, we too, need to have our eyes lifted up from time to time. We too, need to see Jesus risen in triumph and transformed in glory. Our ultimate goal is not to die, but to live! We don't exist to repent, but to live with Jesus in an unbreakable bond of love. Through his transfiguration, Jesus wants to give us a glimpse of our own future, when we will live with him in glory, no longer weighed down by sin, but lifted up by the Spirit.

So let us ask Jesus to take our every act of love and fill it with his presence, that we may live "for his glory and praise".




