

Lazarus is ill, and his two sisters, Martha and Mary, seek Jesus' help. By the time Jesus arrives in Bethany, Lazarus has been dead and buried for four days. Jesus is met by Mary, Martha and the people who have come to console them. Upon seeing their grief, Jesus is deeply moved and he weeps, for he loves Martha, Mary and Lazarus. But more than that, Jesus knew that there were some people in the crowd who had no belief in him nor in the resurrection. And they—those unbelievers—acted like those who had no hope. The Way, Truth, and Life stood before them, and yet they remained unmoved.

Jesus assured the listeners who did believe, that Lazarus' illness did not lead to death. And they would soon see his power at work even over death. And far from death –it would end in resurrection.

Ever the teacher, Jesus used this event as an

amazing opportunity to teach that he is Lord of all and has conquered death. So what can we learn from this event?

Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life. When life's trials get to be too much, it only takes thought of our Saviour to get us back on track. For a Christian, this earthly life isn't all there is. One glorious day Jesus will raise us and bestow upon us the glorified bodies he promised. Therefore, every day is a day to rejoice, for we are his and we are loved unconditionally.

Believers are to grieve with hope. We are not like those with no hope. Our hope is in the Eternal One, who will, one day, resurrect us to eternal life with him.

Jesus has compassion for each one of us. Jesus wants to love us intimately and offers us many opportunities to draw closer to him. We are always and forever held securely in his heart.

Jesus does everything for God's glory. In order to glorify God, we must first have faith in him, in the belief of what he has done, is doing, and will do. And that faith and trust brings glory to God.

Jesus' wisdom and knowledge supersede that of any human being. God's timing is always perfect. We may not see results as quickly as we might want. But God's ways are not our ways.

Let us trust that God is always doing what is best for us.

Holy Week

Throughout the Holy Season and Holy Week please remember to bring your missal to enhance your participation in answering out loud, in some parts of the Passion of Our Lord, as you are the crowd. You are also reminded on Good Friday to bring a flower and/or a sealed prayer card with your disappointments, regrets, frustrations, sinfulness, negligence's, etc. to place at the food of the cross during the Veneration of the Holy Cross. It will be burned in the fire on the Vigil of Holy Saturday. On Good Friday the parish will provide stones at the entrance of the church for those who desire to give to Jesus everything that is in their heart (sorrows, the loss of a loved one, the loss of faith, depression and so on) symbolized by throwing a stone of surrendering everything to His Holy Will at the foot of the Cross. In some countries after the body of a deceased is laid in the ground people throw little stones or dirt in the grave to give their last homage before it is closed and sealed. In other words, we can picture Jesus saying "...it is finished". On Good Friday there will be a collection for the Holy Land. For Easter Vigil (Thursday) and Easter Sunday please bring your bells to ring.

Holy Week "Tenebrae" Service – Wednesday, April 16 at 7:00pm



Tenebrae (meaning 'darkness' or 'shadows') is a religious service that occurs during Holy Week, where believers gather to reflect on the events of Jesus's death. It involves extinguishing candles one by one as

the scripture passages lead us through Christ's passion. This service has deep spiritual and biblical meaning. The candles, darkness and strepitus (Latin referring to a loud noise or crashing sound) urges believers to meditate on Christ's sacrificial death and invites us to reflect on what Christ did that "Good Friday".

Please join us through a visual representation of darkness and the auditory experience of strepitus while being immersed in rich scriptural meaning. Running time under one hour.

Over time, and especially in recent years, this appalling situation has worsened. The Church and our Christian brothers and sisters are counting on your help to maintain a faithful Christian presence in the land of our Lord. Please give generously during Good Friday celebrations.

Lenten Fish Fries Bring Parish Families Together – Article by Ron Kuzlik

This History of Lenten Fish Fries

Friday evening fish fries during Lent have become a staple for many Catholic parishes.

It all started prior to Vatican II when Canadian bishops had a variety of restrictions concerning fasting (eating one full meal and two smaller meals that don't equal another full meal) and abstinence (refraining from eating meat on all Fridays and other designated days).

There were a large number of immigrants from Poland, Germany, and other Central European countries who migrated to Canada and the Midwest of the United States in the 19th Century. Because of the proximity to the Great Lakes and a number of other freshwater lakes, eating fish became an alternative to meatless Fridays.

With that, the Lenten Fish Fry was born.

Over time, these folks began to disperse and settle in other parts of the USA and Canada. And with them, they brought along the tradition of Lenten Fish Fries. Some of these restrictions were loosened after Vatican II in 1965. However, fasting and abstinence were still mandated for Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent.

Most Lenten Fish Fries are sponsored by local Knights of Columbus councils and held at local church parish halls, either alone or with other service organizations. Depending on the venue, there might be several dozen people to as many as 300 or more attendees. The fish fries serve to bring the parish family together and build community. Furthermore, the monies raised at the Knights of Columbus Fish Fries benefit programs that benefit the poor, the elderly, and the challenged, as well as other service projects through local parishes.

Lenten Fish Fries in Manitoba



The Annual Lenten Fish Fry at Mary, Mother of the Church (MMOC) Parish in Winnipeg (<u>Archdiocese of Saint-Boniface</u>) is sponsored by Our Lady of the Prairie Knights of Columbus Council 5264. Brother Knight Ed Stemkoski explained, "Vic Bossuyt and his wife Viviane started this annual event 18 years ago, and they still lead it today. "MMOC parishioners look forward to it every year," he adds.

On the menu are pan-fried Pickerel fresh from Lake Winnipeg, baked potatoes, French fries, homemade coleslaw, buns and a variety of homemade desserts and beverages. The success of the fish annual fries is dependent upon a team of about 30 volunteers to purchase the food, set up the hall, cook and serve guests and do the after-event cleanup.

The Fish Fry Effect



On a side note, Catholics are responsible, at least in part, for McDonald's Filet-O-Fish sandwich – a very unusually popular menu item at a burger joint. When franchise owner Lou Groen opened the first McDonald's in the Cincinnati, Ohio, area in 1959, most of the people there were Catholics. Although his new restaurant was an immediate success, he noticed that on Fridays, his sales decreased by about 75%. Why? Because of the Catholic Church's restriction about eating meat on Fridays.

Groen introduced the Filet-O-Fish sandwich in 1962. Fast forward to the present day, over 300 million Filet-O-Fish sandwiches are sold each year, and nearly a quarter of all McDonald's sales of Filet-O-Fish sandwiches are during Lent – as a result of the Catholic practice of abstinence from meat on Fridays.
