Fourth Sunday of LENT

This Sunday's Gospel is an amazing parable from Jesus about mercy, reconciliation and return to the love of the Father in the Son. The prodigal son is our story because we are all part of it. We can be the younger son, the elder son and/or the father. In addition, this story reflects something amazing about Christianity. No matter our past, our sins and what we have done, Christ frees us from it all, provided we sincerely repent. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is the best way for this to happen.

The younger son- He is selfish, wants to live the party life by wasting the inheritance that he asked for and went to a distant country to become independent, self seeking. He acts like many in our society who do the same as the younger son and only after lots of trials, suffering, hunger and thirst, may come back to the family. He had to admit that he failed and returned to the loyal and loving father.

The Elder Son- He is selfish, prideful and angry. When his brother returns home, he is enraged that his father is celebrating with a party for his brother, given all that he has done to his father by the way he lived. He is confused, frustrated for all that he has done for his father. He shows no mercy to his younger brother and feels entitled because he does 'his duty' and refused to accept that one who sins can receive great mercy. We are like this son as well, not rejoicing in conversion but feeling that we are 'better' or holier than others because we didn't live like the younger brother.

The father- He is the one who lovingly forgives the younger son and desires that the older son accepts his mercy for his brother. He is as God the Father, reaching out to both sons, letting them know that God's mercy is greater than ANYTHING we have done, and he can celebrate our return. For those who have come back to Christ and His Church, we rejoice. For those who have not returned or know Christ and His Church, we eagerly reach out to them so that we can welcome them with open arms as the father did. We can only achieve this through a life of prayer and holiness.

Holy Week "Tenebrae" Service – Wednesday, April 16 at 7:00pm

Tenebrae (meaning 'darkness' or 'shadows') is a religious service that occurs during Holy Week, where believ-

ers gather to reflect on the events of Jesus's death. It involves extinguishing candles one by one as the scripture passages lead us through Christ's passion. This service has deep spiritual and biblical meaning. The candles, darkness and strepitus (Latin referring to a loud noise or crashing sound) urges believers to meditate on Christ's sacrificial death and invites us to reflect on what Christ did that "Good Friday".

Please join us through a visual representation of darkness and the auditory experience of strepitus while being immersed in rich scriptural meaning. Running time under one hour.

Holy Week

Throughout the Holy Season and Holy Week please remember to bring your missal to enhance your participation in answering out loud, in some parts of the Passion of Our Lord, as you are the crowd. You are also reminded on Good Friday to bring a flower and/or a sealed prayer card with your disappointments, regrets, frustrations, sinfulness, negligence's, etc. to place at the food of the cross during the Veneration of the Holy Cross. It will be burned in the fire on the Vigil of Holy Saturday. On Good Friday the parish will provide stones at the entrance of the church for those who desire to give to Jesus everything that is in their heart (sorrows, the loss of a loved one, the loss of faith, depression and so on) symbolized by throwing a stone of surrendering everything to His Holy Will at the foot of the Cross. In some countries after the body of a deceased is laid in the ground people throw little stones or dirt in the grave to give their last homage before it is closed and sealed. In other words, we can picture Jesus saying "...it is finished". On Good Friday there will be a collection for the Holy Land. For Easter Vigil (Thursday) and Easter Sunday please bring your bells to ring.
